# **INYO COUNTY**

# **EMERGENCY MEDICAL CARE COMMITTEE**

# ARTICLE I

NAME

This organization shall be known as the Inyo County Emergency Medical Care Committee (EMCC).
<u>ARTICLE II</u>

## **GEOGRAPHIC AREA**

This committee will serve all of Inyo County.

# ARTICLE III

### **AUTHORIZATION**

Authority for establishing the Emergency Medical Care Committee has been provided by California Health and Safety Code, division 2.5, Section 1797.270 et seq.

# ARTICLE IV

### **PURPOSE**

The EMCC:

- A. Shall function in an advisory manner to the Inyo County Board of Supervisors and the Local Emergency Medical Services Agency, known as the Inland Counties Emergency Medical Agency (ICEMA).
- B. Shall participate in the planning process for the establishment of goals, objectives, policies, and procedures for the local emergency medical services agency, ICEMA.
- C. Shall set at least one annual collective goal to be carried out by the EMCC membership.
- D. Shall assist in the establishment of, and offer advice on, policy and procedures governing pre-hospital care in Inyo County.

- E. Encourage and educate the public to understand the nature of pre-hospital emergency medical care and encourage support throughout the County for development and implementation of effective EMS plans.
- F. Shall at least annually, review the operations of each of the following:
  - 1. Ambulance services operating within the county.
  - 2. Emergency medical care offered within the county, including programs for training large numbers of people in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and lifesaving first aid techniques.
  - 3. First aid practices in the County.
  - 4. Report to the Inyo County Board of Supervisors and ICEMA it's observations and recommendations relative to its review of the ambulance services, emergency medical care, first aid practices, programs for training people in cardiopulmonary resuscitation and lifesaving first aid techniques, and public participation in such programs in Inyo County. The Committee shall also report on the status of completion of the annual EMCC goal. The EMCC shall submit its observations and recommendations to the Inyo County Board of Supervisors, and to ICEMA, on all matters relating to emergency medical services as directed by the Board of Supervisors.

### ARTICLE V

#### **MEMBERSHIP**

- 1) The Inyo County Emergency Medical Care Committee shall consist of thirteen (13) voting members appointed for staggered terms of two (2) years.
- 2) Voting members shall have a professional interest in, or personal commitment to pre-hospital emergency medical care in their community. The members shall include but are not limited to, representatives from the local agencies providing pre-hospital emergency medical care in the County of Inyo (e.g., EMS ground and air providers and hospital emergency departments), three members at large, and one Supervisor from the Inyo County Board of Supervisors.
- 3) Each voting member shall have an equal vote. In the event of a tie vote on any issue, the Chairperson shall abstain from that vote.
- 4) Ex officio non-voting members shall consist of the following individuals who shall receive all agendas and notifications of the EMCC:
  - Bishop Police Department Chief or designee
  - Aspendell South Fork Fire Department Chief or designee
  - Los Angeles Department of Water and Power Superintendent or designee
  - Inyo County Sheriff or designee
  - Inyo County Search and Rescue Coordinator or designee
  - California Highway Patrol Area Commander or designee

- Death Valley National Monument/EMS Coordinator or designee
- American Red Cross representative
- Furnace Creek Fire Department Chief or designee
- Emergency Room Physicians representative
- CA Department of Fish and Wildlife representative
- CalFire Fire Captain for San Bernardino/Inyo/Mono Unit
- Mercy Air Ambulance, Ridgecrest
- Ridgecrest Regional Hospital
- Liberty Ambulance Service
- Inyo County Chief Information Officer
- Forrest Service Regional Fire Chief
- 5) All voting members shall be appointed by the Inyo County Board of Supervisors.
- 6) In the event that prior to the expiration of his/her term, a member ceases to retain the status which qualified him/her for appointment to the committee, his/her membership on the committee shall terminate. The organization which had submitted the person's name who has been terminated from the committee will then review the name and qualifications, and if approved for service will forward the name for appointment to the committee by the Inyo County Board of Supervisors.

### **ARTICLE VI**

#### **OFFICERS & DUTIES**

- A. Elections of officers will occur during the first meeting of the calendar year in odd numbered years.
- B. Officers: General Duties
  - 1. Chairperson

Call regular and special meetings, approve the agenda, preside over meetings, conduct and expedite business in the name of the Committee and sign formal documents for the Committee.

2. Vice-Chairperson

Preside over meetings in the absence of the Chairperson.

- C. Term of office shall be for two (2) years.
- D. Both officers shall be voting members.

### ARTICLE VII

#### **SUBCOMMITTEES**

- A. Authorization: The creation of subcommittees within EMCC may be authorized by the voting members when deemed necessary to facilitate the efficient operation and fulfillment of the organization's objectives.
- B. Purpose: Subcommittees shall be established with clear objectives and purposes outlined by the voting members. These objectives shall align with the mission and goals of the EMCC.
- C. Composition: Subcommittees may consist of members from the general membership, the voting members, or appointed individuals with relevant expertise or interest. The composition of each subcommittee shall be determined by the voting members.
- D. Appointment of Subcommittee Chair: A chairperson for each subcommittee shall be appointed by the voting members. The subcommittee chairperson shall be responsible for leading the subcommittee, facilitating meetings, and reporting progress to the EMCC.
- E. Terms of Office: The term of office for subcommittee members and chairpersons shall be determined at the time of appointment, with the option for reappointment as deemed necessary by the EMCC.
- F. Reporting: Subcommittees shall regularly report their activities, findings, and recommendations to the EMCC. These reports shall be submitted in writing or presented orally during designated meetings.
- G. Authority and Limitations: Subcommittees shall operate within the scope of their designated objectives and authority as defined by the EMCC. They shall not have the power to make decisions or take actions that conflict with the policies, procedures, or directives of the EMCC. Subcommittees meetings may be subject to the Brown Act. The EMCC shall request an opinion from County Counsel with regard to the Brown Act's applicability to a given subcommittee.
- H. Amendments: Amendments to these provisions regarding the formation of subcommittees shall require approval by the voting members in accordance with the procedures outlined in the EMCC by-laws.

#### ARTICLE VIII

#### **MEETING SCHEDULES**

- A. Regular meetings shall be held at least quarterly.
- B. Special meetings shall be held at the discretion of the Chairperson.
- C. All meetings of the committee shall be open to the public and shall comply with all requirements of the Brown Act.
- D. Inyo County Health and Human Services shall attend all EMCC meetings and shall provide staff to the EMCC which includes preparing minutes and other duties as requested to support the purposes of the EMCC.

#### ARTICLE IX

#### **PROTOCOL**

- A. Quorum- A quorum shall consist of 7 voting committee members and a vote of simple majority of the quorum shall constitute a vote of the EMCC.
- B. Teleconference- Voting members may participate in meetings by teleconference as permitted by the Brown Act.
- C. "Teleconference" means a meeting of a legislative body during which the members are in different locations, connected by electronic means, through either audio or video, or both.
- D. All votes taken while teleconferencing must be taken by roll call.
- E. The agenda for the meeting must be posted at all physical and teleconference locations. (72 hours in advance of a regular meeting and 24 hours for a special meeting)
- F. The teleconference location must be identified in the meeting notice, with each location being accessible to the public.
- G. Teleconference meetings must be conducted in a manner that protects the statutory and constitutional rights of the parties or the public appearing before the committee.
- H. The public's right to testify on any item on the agenda must be respected at each location.
- I. The agenda shall provide an opportunity for members of the public to address the committee directly pursuant to Section 54954.3 at each location,
- J. During the teleconference, at least a quorum of the members of the committee shall participate from locations within the boundaries of Inyo County.
- K. The committee shall publicly report any action taken and the vote or abstention on that action of each member present for the action.
- L. Conflict of Interest

Based on perceptions of a reasonable person, an EMCC member must leave the meeting room during all deliberations concerning funding for any project which the member's organization is directly involved or may benefit financially, and/or during discussions which influence the course, scope, or prioritization of services if his/her organization may benefit from such course, scope, or prioritization of services. Such temporary absence during a meeting will be recorded as part of the minutes of that meeting.

#### ARTICLE X

#### **AMENDMENTS**

A. The by-laws of the Committee may be amended by a majority of voting members present.

B. Proposed by-law amendments shall be circulated to the committee in writing at least 15 days in advance of the meeting at which a vote may be called.

## ARTICLE XI

## **RELATIONSHIP TO THE LOCAL EMS AGENCY**

- A. The EMCC may submit any comments regarding the Inyo County EMS programs to the local EMS Agency, ICEMA.
- B. At any time, if the Committee desires, it may request an explanation by the Health Officer for actions he/she has taken which relate directly to the local EMS agency.
- C. Any minority group within the structure of the Committee may submit an official minority report.
