III.	DISCUSSION/ACTION ITEMS:		
	A. EMCC Role in Inyo County/Goals	An overview of what will be presented to the Board of Supervisors on 2/11/25 was reviewed, and discussion was opened. Anna emphasized that the goal is to establish a solid foundation for continued progress and improvement. She highlighted the following points: • The subcommittee reconvened to finalize the Chief's needs and identify key priorities, such as discussing supplemental services, including response vehicles and paid staffing across various departments. • A final review of the short-term, intermediate, and long-term EMS needs, with a focus on mutual aid and improving communication systems. • There is an exploration of a paid staffing model, alongside collaboration with Chiefs to address long-term funding needs. • The committee discussed the most effective methods for recruiting and training EMTs. • Anna noted that training needs are listed broadly and may need more focus. • The EMCC subcommittee's role is to manage the key details and address the inner workings of any remaining needs/concerns. VI.	Public Comment Period	 Steve Davis – Asked about any planned discussions regarding funding support for Olancha FD. Nate Greenberg responded that funding between \$15,000 and \$35,000 had been allocated for EMS-related efforts.

		Nate Greenberg and Jen Roeser also noted that the county has offered options for OCVFD/OCSD to support EMS coverage as well as suggestions to help offset costs. • Brian Baskin – Announced the end of mutual aid with Inyo County, effective March 1st. Members expressed concern over the impacts to the EMS system countywide if this mutual aid ceases. Parties from Inyo County, OCVFD, and OCSD will meet to discuss the continuation of mutual aid and will follow up with Liberty to address. • Jen Roeser – Requested input from the Countywide structure on how it can provide or receive support. • Mike Patterson – Proposed the idea of a Joint Powers Agreement (JPA) to share resources and unify efforts. • Joe Cappello – Asked about how fire chiefs can assist individuals with access and functional needs during emergencies. Anna added that HHS, OEM, ICSO, and GIS are collaborating to identify realistic efforts and solutions for evacuation warnings and orders.
